This week I have been chatting with the children about how they use tablets, phones and computers at home. It is wonderful to hear how confident even our youngest learners are online - but these conversations also reminded me of how important it is to keep them safe. Despite our best efforts, many children are not yet able to recognise the risks of the online world. They can click on things without realising what they are opening or watch videos that aren't suitable for them. That is why your guidance and supervision are so important.
