Message from Mrs Fynn

The weather outside may have been wet this week but that doesn't seemed to have dampened the children's enthusiasm to return to school. I have seen some lovely examples of learning from across the school this week.

Today at Hadleigh Infants and Nursery School has been outdoor classroom day (postponed due to the storm). All children have been exploring the pond area and meeting mini-beasts. For our Nursery and Reception children every day is an outdoor classroom day. Today, the Nursery have also had their snack outside (they made edible sparklers) and some of them noticed a sneaky squirrel snacking on their pumpkin. Reception paid special attention to sounds in the environment and decided to add to those sounds by making musical instruments from natural resources that they found. Year 1 have been undertaking lessons like maths and literacy outside by using natural resources to support counting and number and letter formation. They also used natural resources to create pieces of art by printing. Year 2 have also been demonstrating their addition and subtraction skills outside using objects from the environment, exploring shadows and movement, exploring the impact of the seasons on our plants and trees and making mini best hotels.
