Barriers for our Children	Many children at HINS lack confidence and resilience when expressing themselves creatively, children may lack a growth mindset approach which limits their ability to access their full potential. Children may also have limited exposure to art in a wide variety of styles. Our children find it difficult to reflect on their work and identify areas for improvement.
Implementation	Children will learn to respect, celebrate and understand differences and similarities in traditional art and art from a range of different cultures. We want our children to be able to show resilience in learning and be able to reflect on their work, improve it and evaluate the impact of the changes made using a Growth Mindset approach. We want our children to be able to know a range of art and design techniques and understand when it is appropriate to use each one. We want the children to apply real world experiences and observations to their designs.
