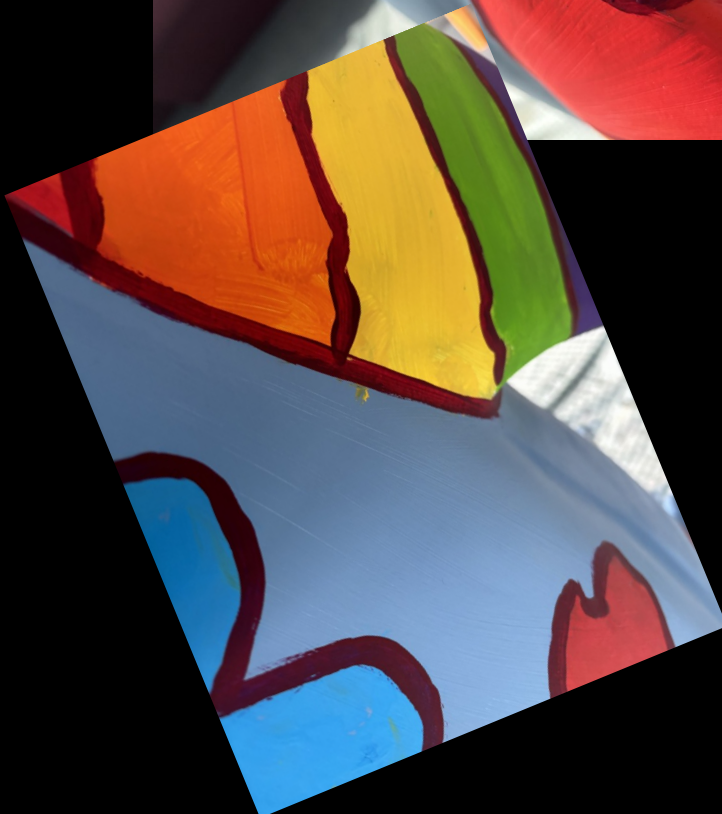
Penguin Update from Miss Johnston:

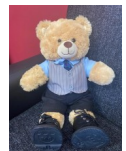
