Message from Mrs Fynn

Earlier in the term I made reference to the new attendance guidance published by the Government. We also had a meeting with a local authority attendance advisor who informed us that we are categorised as “amber” in terms of our levels of attendance. As a result of this I’ve been doing a lot of thinking about how we can move to “green”. My reasoning for this is not what you may think at first. It’s not about the local authority perceptions, it’s about giving our children the best life chances possible. Since the pandemic the attitude of many families to school attendance has seen a subtle shift and school absence levels have crept up. Although the level of school attendance matters to the school, what should matter to you is the attendance level of your own child.

Missing two weeks of school for a (much needed) family holiday means that your child misses approximately 50 hours of new learning that they will not be taught again, however, your child will need to use that missed learning as the foundations for new knowledge to be built upon.

Having frequent irregular days off also has an impact, each day that a child is absent they miss around 5 hours of new learning, this will impact their ability to complete the learning of the next day or week as learning is sequential and builds on the previous days knowledge.

In later life there is a significant correlation between school attendance, exam results and lifetime earning potential.

I realise this may all sound a little dramatic but it is a real concern and we see it impacting on the learning and also happiness and wellbeing children each day.

Of course there are times when your child is too ill to attend school, we all know this, but please do give consideration if your child is well enough to attend. If you feel we can support you with school attendance in any way please do reach out. We all want the best outcomes for the children in our care.
